### 1. Double Layer



Cut two ribbons a little longer than the cardstock.

Lay the narrower ribbon on top of the wider and attach to the back of the card.

# 2. Double Strips with Bow



Cut two different ribbons at different lengths and attach to the card front. Add a bow.

#### 3. Double Tie



Layer one ribbon across a second ribbon at an angle like shown. Tie the botton ribbon across the first.

Attach all four ends of the ribbons to the back of the card - spreading them out as desired.

#### 4. Double Knot



Lay one ribbon right on top of the second ribbon and tie together. Twist the ribbons as you tighten them to get the sides you want showing.





Wrap your ribbon around your cardstock leaving ends sticking out this this. Tie twine or linen thread around the ribbon edges.




# 8. Small Ribbons Tied around Long Ribbons
