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These ribbon techniques are all found in the Extras Video

1. Single Layer Back & Forth



Cut ribbon 3 times the width of the space you want to cover.

Add adhesive to the card front and layer the ribbon back and forth.

2. Ribbon Flags



Cut ribbon and attach it under the cardstock so that just the ends show.


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3. Frayed Ribbon







Many ribbons fray beautifully. After tying your knot, pull on the edges to fray.

Or fray your ribbon first and then wrap them together.

4. Knotted Ribbon





Tie knots in your ribbon before attaching the ends under the cardstock. (cabin card by Cathy Seal)


Be sure to cut your ribbon long enough for this shortening effect.


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5. Pleated Ribbon







Lay a strip of Tear 'N Tape across your paper and peel.

Add your ribbon, pleating as you go.

6. Coloring Your Ribbon







Stampin' Blends are the perfect way to color your ribbon since they dry so quickly.

Two colored ribbon card by Pat Nagy.

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
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7. Weaving





Basket card by Pat Nagy (She wove her ribbon around the basket shape.)



Cut your ribbons so you have as many strips as you want going across an area of cardstock each direction.

Start by attaching one end of each ribbon going the long way. I used a strip of Tear 'n Tape across the top to hold the ribbons. (Leave just a tiny bit of space between each for the weaving.)

Weave the other ribbons like in the photo.

Make sure you have them postitioned right where you want them and then attach the sides to the cardstock.

Attach this piece to your card front and add the top layer with the cutout area on top with


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
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dimensionals.

8. Ribbon Rose














I cut my main piece into 1-1/2" strips so that my hole punch would work to cut out the center of the flower.

Tie a loose double knot in your ribbon and thread both ends into the hole the same direction. Pull to get the look you want.





Attach dimensionals to the back of the center piece and attach to the center of the card front - pull the ribbons over the side panels and attach to the back.
