
These 7 Ribbon Techniques are all found in the Tied Ribbons Video

1. Basic Flat Knot





Cut a piece of ribbon a little longer than the width of your cardstock and attach both ends to the back.

Lay your extra piece of ribbon under the first ribbon.

Loop you ribbon to make the tie - but hold your right hand still and just pull with your left hand. This will make a nice looking knot.

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2. The Hole Technique



Punch a hole where you want the knot to be.

Lay your ribbon across the card and bring one end up through the hole from the back of the card.

Wrap the ribbon all the way around and bring the other end up through the same home - but on the other side of the ribbon. Tie!

3. Bunny Ears Bow



Make two loops with the ribbon - they will look like bunny ears.

Wrap the right loop over the left loop and bring it up through the hole.

Pull the ribbon and adjust as needed.

4. Around a Cut-Out

Any cutout will work for this - just tie the ribbon around!

5. Put Through 2 Holes



Make a template with copy paper cut the same size your card will be.

Fold in half and punch a hole through both to make them equally spaced.

Put your ribbon through both holes to the back of the card.

Bring them back up to front on the opposite sides.

6. Half Knot



Just tie a half knot first, then attach the ends of your ribbon under the cardstock. Notice how the black card uses two different types of knots on the card. (card by

7. Bookmark Loop



Pull both ends of your ribbon up through the hole in the top of your bookmark.

Then pull those ends through the loop you have made.
