

Project Sheet: Quick & Easy Card

It's amazing how just changing the paper can take a card from elegant... to cute... to even a little more masculine. This is one of my favorite ways to use up pretty paper and make a stack of cards without a lot of thinking—just pick your paper and let it do the work!

Supplies:

Card Base :: 8-1/2" x 5-1/2"

Cardstock mat :: 4" x 5-1/4"

DSP :: 1-1/2" x 5-1/4"

Cardstock :: 3-1/4" x 3-1/4"

DSP :: 3" x 3"

Accent/sentiment piece



Instructions:

1. Score the 8-1/2" x 5-1/2" card base in half and fold.
2. Adhere the 4" x 5-1/4" cardstock on the card front.
3. Adhere the 1-1/2" x 5-1/4" DSP strip across the card front.
4. Layer the 3" x 3" DSP square onto the 3-1/4" x 3-1/4" cardstock piece and adhere on the card front (you can do it straight or at an angle).
5. Add your accent and sentiment pieces.
